John arrived with a wooden tray for the longest resonators and we used the wooden tray from the workshop mezzanine for the smaller, wrapped pipes.

Ernie, John Andrews, John

Batts and **I** then loaded the trays into John's van.

They should be delivered to John Parker's workshop around mid week.

TOSA MEMBERS' PLAYING AFTERNOONS IN OCTOBER

After a nine-month absence, on Thursday, 3rd October TOSA was back at The Orion, Campsie, for a Players' Afternoon. Naturally, there were apprehensions as to how the Wurlitzer would perform, having been used only for a handful of shows in the interim. With a public show the following week it was important to give Opus Number 1813 a thorough examination -- just in case. After all, a pipeorgan does need to be played regularly, the blower needs to fill the leather pouches and test the reflex of the motors; one needs to be sure that corrosion has not damaged electrical contacts, that computerised relays have not failed, and that dust particles are not preventing the speech of pipes.

The following week and prior to tuning Neil liberally introduced some humidity into the blower-room intake. Happily, on our day there were no myriad of malfunctions; a few sticky notes were probably inevitable and some tuning deficiencies were revealed. The Wurlitzer piano was also brought up to hall level and engaged; its pump did become noisy even over-heated during the afternoon. But none of this unduly distracted those present. This Thursday get-together drew six players and three listeners. Those who took turns at the Wurlitzer were: **Tom Barber, John Griffiths, Kath Harding, Craig Keller, Peter Robinson,** and **John Batts**. Listeners that day were **Neil Palmer, Dorothy Robinson**, and **Ernie Vale**.

A few weeks later TOSA Players convened at Marrickville Town Hall during the new hours of play. On this occasion, Monday afternoon 28th October, our Opus 875 Wurlitzer was still without one of its ranks on account of the reshuffle of materials. Recently this has been a game of musical chairs, pipes seeking a chest on which to sit! The Post-Horn in the main chamber, hitherto sitting on a Vox Humana chest, has been and currently still is out of action. Its "make-do" chest has been removed to the Solo Chamber to service the Solo's Vox, the old one having been moved to West Ryde. So in the interim, the Wurlitzer had also been without its Vox Humana for a couple of weeks, until this day -- and it now seems to be singing contentedly in the Solo Chamber. By the way, during the afternoon, Neil and Ernie packed the Post-Horn pipes and with some further help of members Graeme Costin and Ian Georgeson brought them down from the chamber into the hall

putting them into pipe-trays prior to transport. John Andrews & his van later conveyed this rank to John Parker's workshop, where the Post-Horn will undergo re-voicing and cleaning; new rack-boards will be fashioned at this time. It will probably be a month or two before the Post-Horn resumes its perch (and its stentorian sounds!).

This day attracted five players and five listeners. Those who played were: Graeme Costin, Kevin Eadie, Ian Georgeson, Basil Kaplan, and John Batts. Intermittent listeners during the extended hours were John Andrews, Jean & Bob Alleway, Neil Palmer, and Ernie Vale. It was a pleasant surprise to welcome the Alleways to the hall for their first-time at a Marrickville Players' event; and the earlier opening had also drawn Basil Kaplan, who was playing the Marrickville Wurlitzer for the very first time. On account of a Council booking we left the hall at 7.00 p.m. (as arranged). Don't forget that ALL members are most welcome to join in on Players' days. N.B.: The Marrickville Players' event next month (25 November) will also begin at 2.30 p.m. (d.v.).

Tony Fenelon & John Atwell

Tony's insatiable interest in lighter music and a love of the majestic sound of the Wurlitzer Unit Orchestra (Theatre Organ) led to his "other" career, leading to his appointment in 1965 as the resident organist at Melbourne's then prestigious Regent Theatre. **Tony** made his first tour of the United States back in 1969, and has returned at least 30 plus times. He has performed at some of the most prestigious theatre organ venues in the U.S. including, the Oakland Paramount, the Ohio Theatre, Columbus, San Sylmar, the Sanfillipo residence, the Orpheum Phoenix and the Pasadena Civic Auditorium, to mention a few.

In 1999, **Tony** returned to his old stamping ground to be featured in the Inaugural Concert of the Regent Theatre's new Wurlitzer Pipe Organ. This concert was an overwhelming success, drawing an unprecedented record attendance since the civic reopening of the Regent. This year **Tony** performed at the Atlanta Fox Theatre on the "Mighty Mo" Moller Theatre Organ as one of the many International Theatre Organists participating at the 2013 ATOS Convention USA.

John receives repeat invitations to play concerts at theatre organ venues around Australia both as a solo performer, as well as in piano/organ duo combination with his long-time colleague and friend, **Tony Fenelon**.

John has also taken his talents overseas on several occasions, playing performances in the USA, Canada, the United Kingdom and New Zealand.

John's musical activities have not been limited to theatre organs. He is an experienced classical organist and pianist, having played many classical organ recitals, participated in concerts for the 'All Stops Out' series on the Melbourne Town Hall organ, 'Music for the People' at the Myer Music Bowl and Melbourne Town Hall, and 'Carols by Candlelight'. In 2012 **John** accepted the invitation of the **City Organist, Robert Ampt**, to play a lunchtime performance on the Sydney Town Hall Grand Organ and was very well received by the large audience. **John** is currently on an overseas concert tour playing in Europe and the UK.

On the 8th April 1925, Opus number 1034 was shipped from the USA and installed in the New Gallery Cinema in time for its opening on the 12th June. It was only the third Wurlitzer to be shipped to the UK and the first to make its way into London's West End. It was the largest and most tonally complete of the three and cost £5,500. Although there were already a few organs installed in cinemas at that time, the Wurlitzer at the New gallery was the first of its type to be heard on recordings and the radio. Initially the series of broadcasts with **Reginald Foort** at the console were to be of 15 minutes duration, but such was the public delight that they were increased to 1 hour – 4:15 to 5:15pm every Wednesday. **Foort** continued to record for HMV and his disc of 'In a Monastery Garden' became a million seller, breaking every industry sales record at the time. Owing both to Foort's expertise and the wonderful mellow and 'lush' voicing of this particular instrument, the New Gallery Wurlitzer was an immediate and unprecedented success with the public starting a theatre organ 'boom' in this country which saw over six hundred instruments installed in theatres during the 1920s and 30s.This happy state continued until for some reason cinema owners stopped Foort's broadcasts – and he resigned in November 1927.

Florence DeJong was appointed principal organist, a position she held until June 1938. There were several assistant organists appointed including Florence's sister, Ena Baga during 1928. Other solo organists included Austin Rayner, Sidney Wallbank, Wilson Oliphant and finally Cecil Chadwick who left in October 1947.

In 1953, after a decline in business, the Rank Organisation (who owned the New Gallery) agreed to sell the lease of the New gallery cinema to the Seventh Day Adventist Church for £130,000. Between 1953 and 1992, when the church vacated the property, the organ was heard regularly - both during church services and at privately arranged concerts and silent films. During this time the Wurlitzer was slightly modified by S.J. Wright and Sons, the UK representatives for the Wurlitzer company, and some percussions and effects and the second touches were removed. At the same time the console was re-built and placed in front of the stage. The xylophone, glockenspiel, chimes and snare drum remained.


In 1975 a concert was arranged with **Reginald Porter-Brown** at the Wurlitzer, this led to more concerts and the Cinema Organ Society (COS) taking on some care of the organ and whilst the Glockenspiel, Chimes and Snare Drum functioned, the Xylophone was not wired at the console. This was rectified by 1989. At the end of January 1992 the Seventh Day Adventists surrendered their lease to Crown Estates and a farewell concert was arranged with **David Lowe** and **Ena Baga**. The building was Grade II listed in 1992, and this listing also included the original 1925 Wurlitzer installation.

Between 2005-6, having been closed for some 13 years, the building underwent a major refurbishment and became the flagship store of the Habitat group. During the building's conversion the Wurlitzer was completely restored to its original condition by the specialist firm Theatre Organ Restorations Ltd.

The new Habitat store opened on 28th April 2006 with the Wurlitzer being played throughout the day by **Richard Hills.** Regular concerts on the instrument took place between 2006-8 and again between 2010-11. During this time the instrument was also featured on national radio and television.



The chambers were behind the grill presumably In early 2011 it was announced that the New Gallery would become one of the flagship stores in the Burberry chain, and Habitat vacated the premises in March 2011.





St Augustine's pipe organ was built in 1886 in England by William Hill and commissioned for the concert hall in Pitt Street. For a short time it was moved to St Carthage's Cathedral in Lismore, and finally was moved to St Augustine's Balmain. Only a small number of William Hill organs in original condition have survived in Australia. This famous English organ maker exported organs all around the world including the one in Sydney Town Hall.

Majestic and powerful pipe music will be performed by the world renowned Amy Johansen, one of Australia's most charismatic organists.
