

MUSIC FOR THE PEOPLE

On SUNDAY 20th SERTEMBER, Willoughby Municipal Council presented a free concert starring our member, Cliff Bingham and local Chatswood organist Paul Edgar on the Town Hall organ, with supporting artists.

As Paul explained to the audience he was playing straight but Cliff was playing crooked.

Paul played two items by Bach - "Jesu joy of man's desiring" and the "Toccata and Fugue in D minor," then a sketch for the flutes contrasting the flute and tibia ranks. His tour de force was a stirring performance of "Crown Imperial" by Sir William Walton.

Less familiar to your reviewer were the items featured by Cliff Bingham except for two old war horses "Twelfth Street Rag" and "Blaze Away" by Holzmann. Cliff proved his mastery of the instrument not only in his solo numbers but in his tasteful accompanying. The warmth of the reception afforded to both organists proved that the organ sounded fine, straight or crooked!

DON BAKER AT CHATSWOOD

DON BAKER is a big man with a big reputation as one of America's foremost Theatre Organists. For the past ten years, he has been a demonstrator on the Staff of the Conn Organ Corporation - a job he did admirably well at Chatswood last month. The 3-M model he used was placed in an ideal acoustical setting - in mid-stage.

In spite of the petrol shortage a fair-sized audience gathered to hear his performance. Regretably only about 10% of the programme was played on the Wurlitzer, not 50% as TOSA had been led to believe. We are grateful to Elvy's for their co-operation, and especially, the proceeds of \$150 towards the Capitol Organ Fund.

RPB in Newcastle. Prior to his Hammond organ recital in Newcastle RPB appeared twice on television. The first occasion was in the 6 p.m. news, in which he was featured playing and talking at the organ of St. John's Church. Later in the evening he was in the programme "Here Today", playing a Lowrey organ and being interviewed. RPB on a Hammond is another remarkable experience.

RPB in the Churches. The recitals in St. John's, Parramatta, St. Columbs, West Ryde and St. Anne's, Strathfield, were very well received; the programmes must have surprised a lot of people as to content - once again carefully balanced programmes to suit many tastes.

RPB at the RSL Club, Bondi. A most popular recital on the Rodgers organ; the programme opened with RPB playing "A Summer Place" (the signature tune of Clark Brick Ltd.) with Ian Davies on the piano. The programme included "Finlandia" which showed off the organ's capabilities in the "straight" role. The evening finished with Ian and Reg playing duets for a "Singalong". Amongst many distinguished persons attending was the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

TRINGHAM ENJOYS U.S. HOSPITALITY

Col Tringham reports that his recent visit to the United States was made much more enjoyable due to the attention of the members of the American Theatre Organ Associations.

In Boston Col managed to hear Tom Hazelton (of San Francisco) play a very enjoyable concert on the Two manual, fourteen rank, WurliTzer installed in the Stoneham Town Hall.

Later Colin heard Robert MacDonald play a three manual Rodgers at the Triton Regional High School and reported that the audience was the most appreciative he has ever seen anywhere.

Later Colin met Robert MacDonald at his usual home - the superb Riverside Church in New York City. This Organ has five manuals and 222 Ranks and sounds magnificent. The entire instrument is kept fully maintained by Mr. A. Bufano who completely rebuilt the instrument in 1967. Mr. Bufano showed Colin around the entire instrument and gave him a very interesting demonstration of the use of "Perflex" a very thin, mouldable rubber compound which seems to be the answer to most Organ maintenance problems.

Mr. MacDonald would be pleased to show Australian visitors' around the Church and the Organ PROVIDING they phone or write beforehand to ensure a suitable time. Mr. MacDonald also knows famous New York Organist Billy Nalle and when he heard of Colin's interest in this Organists work, he arranged for a dinner at the top of a New York sky scraper with Colin, & Billy Nalle and Bob MacDonald. Colin reports that this was a very enjoyable highlight of the whole tour.

Later Colin made the trip to Baltimore where friends drove him to see the fabulous Dick Kline's WurliTzer which must be one of the most magnificent home installations in the world. Dick is also a fine Organist and really showed the Organ at its best. Later, at the home of Jean and Marvin Lautzenheiser, Colin saw a three manual, fifteen rank Wurli which is hooked up to a Computer. Marvin is a Computer programmer and he has organised the programmes to enable the organ to be played via an I.B.M. punch card machine. It is also possible to play a piece

on the Organ and then have the Computer analyse the playing to a very fine degree. Jean also plays Organ professionally at the Richmond Theatre in Virginia.

Colin says he is anxious to go again and next time will make sure he does not miss the annual convention.

THE TROUBLE SHOOTERS

The well known firm of ERIC ANDERSONS, who began nearly fifty years ago as a retailer of Musical Instruments and sheet music and who later moved into the Radio and T.V. field, have started to reverse the swing by becoming interested in the servicing of Electronic Organs.

With several amateur organists on their staff at the Alexandria workshops and their background of electronics they realized three years ago that here was a field in which an organized same-day service on a large number of brands was completely missing. After much research an Organ Service Department was set up a year ago and after negotiations with various retailers of organs, the department is now well under way with several hundred service jobs completed on various brands to its credit.

They have, over the last year, built up a comprehensive stock of genuine spare parts for the more popular brands of organs so that they are now in a position to invite inquiries from the trade on a buy or exchange basis.
