



APPEALING FOR NEW MEMBERSHIP SECRETARY

Dear Peter Bidencope,

Thank you for your kind words in the December TOSA NEWS. Yes 1989 was a very bad year for me personally with the death of two friends and neighbours and the need to move my Father and another elderly person into retirement villages has certainly kept me busy.

It is only my need to clear up the residue of the four tangled Estates which has caused me to give up my role as Secretary of T.O.S.A. However I also filled the role of Membership Secretary and have re-entered all of our records onto Computer. Disks and have become familiar with the program we use. Although I will be happy to continue to fulfil this task for our new Secretary in the immediate future, I would like to pass this job onto another member as quickly as possible. The amount of work is not odious - it involves keeping the membership list up to date - entering new members and address changes. This takes about an hour a week. However once a month it is necessary to print out the 600 odd labels we need for mailing out each issue of TOSA NEWS on our daisy-wheel printer (which goes with the job) and this takes about one hour - a bit more if the list has to be re-sorted into postcode order as required by the Postal authorities.

About once every three months it is necessary to print out a complete up to date membership list for use by the Secretary and this takes about two to three hours of printing time.

The requirements for the job are an I.B.M. compatible printer which can take either $3\frac{1}{2}$ or 5 inch disks. I am personally running this program with only 256K of memory on a Commodore amiga with a Sidecar attachment (which enables it to run the I.B.M. programs) however a more conventional system with a hard disk would probably make the program run much faster.

I am hoping to travel overseas this year, hence the need to give up this position.

The person filling this job does not have to attend Committee meetings, but must be prepared to keep the list confidential as T.O.S.A. does not make its members names and addresses available to anyone. Full documentation is on file for the program we use.

Finally I must say that it has been my pleasure to observe the large degree of co-operation and the peace and harmony which have been evident at our Committee meetings in the past few months.

LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Firstly, let me congratulate you on the way "TOSA NEWS" is developing, especially in your "Letters to the Editor" section.

An active, responsive "Letters to the Editor" section such as this is always an indicator of the effectiveness of a publication. Quality daily newspapers and magazines like the "Bulletin" are testament to this.

I wish to refer to one such letter in your December 1989 issue, on page 14. This was a letter from "A member concerned with TOSA's future". I am extremely gratified by his (or her?) positive comments about my published reports and reviews, however, this letter states that "selfish attitudes from society committees and members have barred" me "from contributing to the magazine". This is not true.

This year [1989] I have not offered any article for publication by any TOSA newsletter, anywhere. Further I have never been informed verbally, or in writing by TOSA NSW, of any "barring", not even over the infamous "grapevine"!

For as much as I was gratified to see that any action that might keep my written words away from those interested in theatre organ was described as "selfish", I must inform your correspondent that this was not the case. I simply have not had time to write. As a result nothing has been submitted this year.

In 1989 I have not had time due to my work commitments and my time overseas, to write, to practise, to perform, or to attend concerts. I believe that I have only attended one concert in Sydney (Jonas Nordwall) this year.

However, I do have some plans to write over Christmas. Firstly, a story on my trip to the U.S.A. during August/September, where I met many interesting theatre organ personalities and workers, and played a number of fabulous instruments. Another planned story/information sheet is to be about the 3/15 (from 18 sets acquired) WurliTzer theatre organ that I have purchased in Seattle which will be coming to Australia early in the New Year. These articles will be submitted to selected newsletters/magazines and they can do with them what they please.

Civil & Civic's contract has now been extended to include decoration of the interior, reinstatement of the ceiling dome over the auditorium, new seating and installation of orchestra pit.

The good news is that Ballarat City Council has agreed to be responsible for the re-design/replacement of the organ lift, consultations with George Stephens and the possible re-voicing/regulating of the organ when the theatre restoration is comp-

Recently the console was carefully and safely stored in the back-stage 'piano room' - in very good company with South Street's Steinway and Bechstein grand pianos. The theatre is to revert to its second name - "Her Majesty's" and a grand opening Gala Week is planned for the last week in July 1990, including a Gala Compton Concert on 30th July. Further details will be passed on when known.
