#### TOSA(NSW) MEMBERS' AFTERNOONS IN SEPTEMBER 2017


September members' meetings at both venues were enjoyed by those who attended.

At Campsie on the morning of 11th September, the console was brought up to stage level. Controlling the lift to make it stop exactly at hall level is not easy, so the stage is simpler. The Wurlitzer piano went up first and was pushed onto the stage; away from the lip it is surprising how its sound seems muted because when the piano is on the wooden floor at hall level its output is immediate and noticeable. The new coiled wind-lead allows the once noisy motor to be placed well away from the console and the piano. No major difficulties were experienced by those at the console, though some quirks were audible on some of the channels. The new Uniflex control-system is yet to be installed, but expectations are that this will be available by the time of the Christmas show at the Orion.

That Thursday, the players who took their turns on the Wurlitzer bench were: **Tom Barber, Graeme Costin, Craig Keller, and John Batts.** The exclusive listener of that day was **Kevin Clancy.**



Since my last visit Simon had enhanced the ambience of the room by adding lamps sitting on the console either side of the music rack. The organ was sounding even better thanks to Simon continuing to fine tune ranks so they sound very close to a real theatre organ.

The afternoon started on time with Simon inviting playing members to play several items each and so **David Badman** was

first up on the organ bench.

Craig Keller thanked Simon, his wife Anna and daughter Harriet for inviting us to the Bijou to enable TOSA members to experience the George Wright 4/72 Allen Organ.

Graeme Costin brought along a musical quiz which required you to identify the movie in which the music that Graeme played was used, who wrote the music and who wrote the lyrics. There were four movies and John Batts was the winner with Craig Keller coming a close second.

One of the many hilights was a visit to the Cathedral of St. Stephen in Passau which is considered to be the 'Venice of Bavaria' The Cathedral is located at the highest point of Passau's Old City. This mighty three aisled basilica is the largest 17th-century Baroque building to be found north of the Alps. With over 17,000 pipes and 233 registers, its organ is regarded as the world's biggest church organ.
