



September 11th, Sunday, 3 p.m.

Arno Schonstedt, Professor of Organ and Harpsichord at the Church Music Institute of Westphalia, Germany and Organist at the 700 years old Herford Munster, makes a return visit to Australia in August and September, playing recitals in Perth, Launceston, Hobart, Sydney and Melbourne. On this date he will be playing in the Futter Hall at the King's School, Parramatta. Professor Schonstedt will give a recital for the Organ Society

of works by Bach, Buxtehude, Bohm, Bruhns and Reger. The organ at this school is, as most of our readers will know, the very beautiful Pogson Organ Since it's installation about ten years ago it has become known as one of the finest concert instruments in Australia.

September 21st, Wednesday, 8 p.m.

Visiting Concert Artist Don Jenkins will be playing at a Concert in the Ryde Civic Hall on Wednesday, 21st September at 8 p.m.. Don will be playing a Kimball Organ. He came to Australia for the Music Exhibition in Melbourne and while here will be concertising in the Capital cities and elsewhere. Admittance \$2.00, Children and Pensioners \$1.00. BYRON MELCHER at the Marrick ville Town Hall playing our WurliTzer. Here is a chance to hear Byron Melcher, the well known American Theatre Pipe Organ Concert Artist. Byron is making a whirlwind 8-day tour of Eastern & Southern Australia to introduce the new three manual Thomas Organ. He was President of the Los Angeles Chapter of A.T.O.S. and is featured regularly at A.T.O.S. Conventions. This will be a good chance to hear this popular artist. Admission \$3.00, TOSA Members \$2.50, Pensioners and Children \$1.50.

October 8th, Saturday, 2.30p.m.

On this date Ian Davies will be presenting a Concert on the WurliTzer pipe organ (originally the Civic Theatre instrument) at 10 Caloola Road, Wentworthville. The Assisting Artist will be Miss Roslyn Green who will be playing a spinet three manual Wurlitzer electronic organ. It will be an interesting comparison between the original WurliTzer pipe organ and it's modern counterpart made by the same company. We can be sure that Ian has planned an excellent programme. October 19th. Wednesday. 8p.m.

An Organ Spectacular will be held at the Bankstown Civic Centre on this date. As far as is known at present six dealers will be exhibiting organs. This will be a chance for members who are contemplating the purchase of a new organ to compare some of the instruments they may be interested in. HOME ORGAN CONCERTS.

Membership Secretary has been busy attending Home Organ Concerts and sends this report on two he recently attended.

Members Ritchie Willis and Norm Read have at least one organ concert at their Mortdale home each month and on July 30th Neil Jensen from Brisbane was featured. Neil is indeed a showman and his playing skill leaves little to be desired. He has assured us he will be back again next year so all who were present at this concert will certainly deem that good news.

The other home organ concert was on August 6th when all the Mortdale patrons were invited to the home of David and Beverly Parsons. More than sixty guests including many TOSA members travelled to Beecroft to hear David on the Conn 651 three manual Theatre Organ. David's programme, as always was extremely varied with classical, pop and most other categories in between. I've always known his repertoir to be most extensive and his playing of nearly three pages of requests only further emphasized it. A vote of sincere thanks was moved and acclaimed by those present to show their appreciation of a wonderful evening of music and fellowship.

Most members will not be aware that next year's National Convention is to be hosted by the South Australian Division in Adelaide. Those people fortunaye enough to atten the "Sunshine Sixth" in Brisbane this year will have a good idea of what's in store for 1978,

The normal format involves a top-ranking overseas organist together with several local artists, usually one from each state present. We have a feast of organ music with a little sight-seeing thrown in. The Convention runs from the evening of Good Friday 'till around lunch time on Easter Monday. The atmosphere is extremely convivial and a good time is assured.

You will, no doubt, realise that reservations anywhere at Easter are in great demand and the holding of the Adelaide Festival in 1978 has only served to heighten the accommodation problem so we have reserved in advance: 1. Flight departing Sydney 24.3.78 at 0850 arriving Adelaide 1010.

- 2. Accomodation at South Terrace Travelodge (next to Wyatt Hall where the S.A.Division 's 2/12 WurliTzer is housed) on bed and full breakfast basis-
- 3. Flight departing Adelaide 27.3.78 at 1525 arriving Sydney 1840.

The cost for the above three items (using current air-fares) is approximately \$206 per person (slightly more for single room or less for triple room occupancy) but remember the actual convention cost is also to be added. As an example the Brisbane '77 Conv ention costs were \$30 which included transport to functions, two lunches, the main Convention dinner and of course entry to all the functions. Should 15 or more people choose to travel on both the forward and return flights the cost could be reduced to around \$190. An application form is included in this issue and it is asked that anyone interested complete the form and return it, together with your deposit as soon as possible to the address shown. Accomodation for only 40 is being held and it's doubtful that extra beds will be available so fill it in now and be assured of a great three and a half days in Adelaide.

Peter has supplied me with the following information which he feels may be of interest to his many admirers.

At the age of 8 he sat for Grade 6 of the Associated Board of the Royal School of Music, London and passed with Distinction which made him a child prodigy. He passed his Final Grade of the Associated Board when he was 18, obtaining an excellent pass. He then turned to light music with a stint at the Theatre Royal, Dublin and then became a Ballroom and Vaudeville artist performing in England as well as Ireland. After more seasons in England he went to South Africa where he toured with Chipperfield's Circus for two years as well as doing 30 broadcast programmes for the South Africa Broadcasting Commission.

In 1968, at the age of 30 he came to Australia, residing at Sydney when he joined TOSA, for which organisation he played for in Sydney, Orange, Brisbane and Adelaide. He tells me that he was the first cinema organist from Sydney to play a full public recital on the Pulteney Grammar School Wurlitzer. We, of course, have also heard him many times at Marrickville. Since early 1976 Peter has modified his style of playing and his forthcoming concert at Marrickville will exemplify this. He has recorded two programmes on the Hammond Organ for the A.B.C. Sydney and has had considerable experience in R.S.L. Clubs in musical backing of acts. He is organist for the Touring Theatre show, Tribute to Broadway as noted in our last issue.

Peter says his main interests these days are: The promotion of the organ and giving young players the benefit of his wide experience, helping refurbish the ex-Capitol WurliTzer for us and-Making New Friends.
