JOHN ATWELL... PIRO JETUTA JER

JOHN ATWELL FIRST CAME TO THE ATTENTION OF THEATRE ORGAN ENTHUSIASTS AUSTRALIA WIDE, WHEN HE PLAYED A SOLO SPOT AT A TOSA EASTER CONVENTION IN 1968 AT THE DENDY THEATRE, BRIGHTON NEAR MELBOURNE. HE WAS, HOWEVER, WELL KNOWN TO ENTHUSIASTS FROM HIS HOME CITY OF ADELAIDE, WHERE HE HAD GAINED HIS MUSICAL TRAINING ON BOTH PIANO AND CLASSICAL ORGAN. IT WAS IN ADELAIDE THAT HE GOT HOOKED ON THE SOUND OF THE THEATRE ORGAN AND HE QUICKLY TAUGHT HIMSELF THE STYLE OF PLAYING REQUIRED FOR THESE INSTRUMENTS.

IN 1971, JOHN MOVED TO MELBOURNE TO STUDY FOR HIS PHD IN BIOCHEMISTRY AT THE MELBOURNE UNIVERSITY. SINCE THEN, HE HAS BEEN ABLE TO COMBINE SUCCESSFULLY HIS CAREER IN SCIENCE WITH HIS MUSICAL ACTIVITIES. JOHN'S REPUTATION AS A PLAYER ON BOTH ELECTRONIC AND THEATRE PIPE ORGANS HAS STEADILY INCREASED DURING HIS RESIDENCE IN MELBOURNE. HE HAS PLAYED CONCERTS ON PIPE AND ELECTRONIC INSTRUMENTS IN MOST STATES OF AUSTRALIA. PERFORMANCES WITH TONY FENELON AS A PIANO-ORGAN DUO HAVE GAINED BOTH ARTISTS CONSIDERABLE ACCLAIM.

HE WAS FORMERLY A TEACHER WITH THE YAMAHA MUSIC FOUNDATION SCHOOLS AND NOW TEACHES SOME STUDENTS PRIVATELY. JOHN IS ALSO IN DEMAND AS A JUDGE OF ORGAN COMPETITIONS. HE HAS ADJUDICATED COMPETITIONS AROUND MELBOURNE AS WELL AS NATIONAL FINALS OF THE YAMAHA ELECTONE FESTIVAL AND YAMAHA MUSIC SCHOOLS AWARDS.

JOHN IS NOW OFFICIAL ACCOMPANIST FOR THE MAROONDAH SINGERS, A CHOIR SEEN NATIONALLY EVERY CHRISTMAS EVE ON CAROLS BY CANDLELIGHT. HE ALSO ENJOYS ARRANGING MUSIC FOR THEM.

DEAN HERRICK

N.M.Froggett, of the Johannesburg Theatre Organ Society, has sent us the following Obituary for DEAN HERRICK, who died on the 24th July.

"IN MEMORIAM Broadcaster, organist, 20th Century showman, DEAN HERRICK, last of the greats in the Southern Hemisphere, will be remembered for the unfailing pleasure he has given to South African audiences for the last 44 years. His support to the South African Theatre Organ Society, and his wealth of knowledge and advice. Echoing John Potter's words, much could be written of his life and career. We, of the S.A.T.O.S., will miss the friendly personal link. Dean would always welcome visitors to his home and introduce them to his beloved Wurlitzer.

Another little known fact is that Dean was a favourite of Jesse Crawford, also a very competent photographer, being an A.R.P.S. He leaves his wife, Wynne, a son and daugter - and a magnificent library of recordings".

Keith Jarred, of Johannesburg, writes to say that Dean's family are putting a double album on the South-African market in memory of him. Keith thinks that the U.K. would be interested and, if members will let the editor know whether they would like a copy, we shall contact Mrs. Wynne Herrick to see if the records can be released here.

COACH TOURS AND HIKES TO BE ANNOUNCED.



PORTLAND BROADWAY THEATRE MAY BE RAZED.

Portland, Oregon, Nov. 4 -- Portland's 55 year-old Broadway Theatre may be torn down to make way for a parking garage for the Performing Arts Centre. The theatre is across Southwest Broadway from the Paramount Theatre which is to be the focal point of the new performing arts centre. When the theatre was built in 1926, it was one of the finest showcases in the Northwest and its elaborate marquee has long been a downtown landmark.

The performing Arts project includes renovation of the Paramount as a concert hall and upgrading of the civic auditorium in addition to construction of 1,400-seat and 450-seat theatres on the block directly south of the big Paramount.

SAN DIEGO CHAPTER SELLING STYLE "D" CONSOLE.

San Diego Chapter A.T.O.S. will sell its Style "D" (2 manual) Wurlitzer console and relay in the near future when it is replaced by a three manual console and solid state relay system. Asking price of the package is listed in "The Posthorn", official newsletter at \$2,200.

JOHANNESBURG ORGAN FIGURE, DEAN HERRICK DIES.

Dean Herrick, famed Johannesburg radio broadcaster, showman and organist, died in that City 24th July last. In his early years in the United States he was a pupil of the late Jesse Crawford. He emigrated to Johannesburg, South Africa and became a public figure in the entertainment world as an organist and later in radio and television production. He purchased and installed a large Wurlitzer, one of several sent to South Africa by the North Tonawanda Firm, from the M.G.M. Theatre Chain. He was also one of the staunch supporters of the South African Theatre Organ Society. As a memorial to him, his family plans to produce and distribute a double album of his music.

LOS ANGELES DISCO OBTAINS WURLITZER CONSOLE FOR HALLOWEEN DECORATION.

Plans for decorating in a Halloween motif had the staff of Circus Disco, a West Hollywood, California, night spot, in a tizzy to find suitable props to create the customary "spooky" atmosphere. An organ console, it was decided, was needed to lend the phantomized opera idea. A call to "The Console" office gave the staff information about Wes Pepiot, Organ Enterprises owner, and from him the Disco people obtained a two manual Wurlitzer console formerly owned by an L.A. organ buff. The keydesk worked out better than expected. It not only gave the Halloween decor a proper finish, but disco owners have decided to keep the two manual console and make it serve as a light console for the intricate system used in the building.

OLD ORGANLOGUES AVAILABLE IN ENGLAND.

Super '8' Sound Film projector owners in England are currently being offered two 1931 "Organlogues" that were produced in the U.S. Listed as 'Centaclassics' films, they are sold by Widescreen Centre, 48 Dorset Street, London, WlH, England. The first, #165 is "Melodies of Love" featuring Lew White and a vocalist. Film #166 features four organists - Jesse Crawford playing 'Beyond the Blue Horizon' -- Ann Leaf playing 'Just One More Chance' -- Dick Leibert with 'Love Songs of the Nile' and Lew White rendering the old favourite "Stormy Weather". Cost of the prints 22,33,24,36 pounds each respectively.

OLD THEATRE NAME RESTORED TO TACOMA CENTRE FOR PERFORMING ARTS.

Backers of the Pantages Centre project held a mock funeral early this month and a wake for the Roxy Theatre, Tacoma, Washington, to mark the rebirth of the Pantages Theatre in the upcoming Pantages Centre for the Performing Arts. Contracts totaling \$3,327,962 have been awarded for restoration and new construction work.

Seattle Architect Richard McCann, who designed the restoration of Seattle's Fifth Avenue Theatre and the Orpheum Theatre in San Francisco, is in charge of the Tacoma project. He once worked under the guidance of the late Marcus B. Priteca, who designed most of the Pantages circuit houses.

The theatre was opened in 1918 and was renamed the Roxy in the 1930's. A Robert Morton organ was installed at one time in the neo-classic designed house.
