Going round via Oyster Bay shops is longer but safer as you turn left from the street into the private driveway. The other way forces you to turn right over double white lines at a blind corner.

Turn into Bates Drive and follow the road around, through the lights at Kareela and down the hill, driving up the other side (Carvers Road).

Turn right at the roundabout into Oyster Bay Rd and follow round left at the Oyster Bay Shopping area, into Como Road.

Follow that road and at the Give-way sign, turn left into Georges River Road and follow round until you get to Cook Road.


Turn left into Cook Road, which then becomes Caravan Head Road at the top of the hill.

MARTIN ELLIS is a concert artist that bridges the boundaries between traditional classical and theatre organ. Equally proficient in both playing styles Mr. Ellis performs on organs of distinction in the United States and abroad, offering a contemporary perspective to music enthusiasts of all genres. In his home town of Indianapolis, Indiana, Martin appears frequently with the Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra and was the featured organist to play the premier concerts of Saint-Saens' "Organ" Symphony No. 3 on the newly installed pipe organ in ISO's Hilbert Circle Theatre. Since that time, he has been a featured performer in the Indianapolis Symphony's renowned "Yuletide Celebration" in 2009, and continues to perform on numerous classical and pops concerts featuring organ and symphony fostering new and innovative ideas in the use of organ with orchestra.

**Mr. Ellis** has been a featured artist at convention's of The American Guild of Organists, The Organ Historical Society, and The American Theatre Organ Society.

In addition to concert activities, **Mr. Ellis** serves as Organist and Associate Director of Music for North United Methodist Church in Indianapolis where he presides over the church's three pipe organs, including the IV manual, 76 rank Kimball/Reynolds organ in the sanctuary.

For well over a decade now **Martin** has worked as an arranger and at the keyboard with the renowned Indianapolis Childrens Choir. Martin records and performs as a member of "Trio Con Brio." Along with artists Donna Parker and Jonas Nordwall, the "Trio" gained it's fame by adapting classical, orchestral, and popular music for performance with three organs simultaneously. Along with an active recording schedule Trio performs on many of the countries high profile organ installations.

# 14. GENERAL BUSINESS

Frank Lewis asked about the rumours regarding the appearance of the Marrickville organ exterior case and it's visibility in the hall.

Geoff replied that we are aware of the visual problem and have been approached by Council to move the organ to the back of hall. We would have a complete restructure, build a mobile room and have room for enhancements. Waiting on a reply from Council.

Jack Lawson suggested that to keep young people interested and convince them the organ is an entertainment machine we should invite school children, once a month, to hear the organ playing a silent movie, show them around in groups to see the chambers and keep them interested. John Andrews replied that we make it an item for Committee consideration.

Peter Held paid credit to the Society by remarking that he was pleasantly surprised with the latest David Bailey concert, stating the organist was excellent and organ well tuned.

Complimented Geoff on the new innovation whereby the new Treasurer and two new Committee members expressed a few words about themselves. Mentioned advancing the exposure of the Society's music to the public, e.g. 39 years upwards, by more advertising.

John Andrews endorsed some of Peter's remarks, and commented that the singular reason why Marrickville organ sounded so well on that day was entirely due to David Bailey.

Bob Alleway - Mentioned sending TOSA News by email; Geoff replied it has been recently discussed by the Committee and we are working on the issue. Bob also mentioned that members who have an email address, could have TOSA News delivered electronically and in colour rather than by post, resulting in saving the Society money.

John Shaw - Further to Peter Held's remarks, John spoke about following up with advertising for concerts e.g. equivalent to \$15,000 free advertising this year has been with radio, local Sydney and Sunday newspapers. Seniors newspaper was paid advertising but unfortunately didn't give us the desired effect of attracting many new members. We have a mailing list, which has been in place the last couple

of years, and is regularly updated. Finally, word of mouth has been the very best way of attracting new members to TOSA.

Russell Smith - Email (read by Geoff) stating he was unable to attend the AGM but would like to convey some thoughts in regard to attending the ATOS Convention in Cleveland USA. Declining attendances are similar to ours and to attract younger players we need to modify the name of our concerts and recitals - be called shows - with accent on the music offered, rather on the player delivering it.

Variety in both content and performance seemed to be increasingly essential.

ATOS and others should drop the word Society from publicity, it was well received by overseas members.

A positive trend is the emergence, through the youth initiatives of ATOS and others, of highly talented young new players who will be worth seeing when they visit us.

While mostly the in-theatre venues in and around Cleveland are magnificent in both appearance and quality of the instruments, they and other venues have significant problems with access; we are fortunate in this way even though we would like it to be better. Our ability to present shows almost monthly was widely envied. Cont.

Russell was surprised, that only one out of the eleven events, featured live projection of the performer-noticeably where the console of the Wurlitzer was in the orchestra pit and the lift no longer functions. The artist could only be seen on the movie screen and had to leap out of

the pit between items to interact with the audience. The lack of projection disappointed those who had become accustomed to it.

Digital recordings are vital to preserving the skills of today's artists and perhaps the instruments into the future.

The forums reached the conclusion that the quality of the artists and instruments is critical to on going success. Russell came back feeling that TOSA is right up there with the consistency and quality of our events - but we need to maintain and further enhance them as we continue to try new ways to promote what we do, and attract new audiences and members.

The final show was open to the general public and an official reviewer rated it less than stellar, performances were in the dark

(no spotlight), MC announcer, staging and music was average.

John Andrews suggested that Russell's email be circulated to Committee.

Ray Russell mentioned that there are 5 pages in the latest ATOS journal of the 2009 Cleveland Ohio Convention, which gave an excellent review.

Robert Gliddon would like it be recorded at the AGM - how much we appreciate Russell Smith's assistance and guidance in putting on our own presentations. We have led the way with other divisions in both Australia and overseas Societies, regarding our professional visual presentations for concerts. The screen is an added enhancement and we appreciate Russell on raising the standard of our concerts.

Geoff Brimley replied that we certainly endorse the above and compared to other states we are very professional in our presentation. Geoff has recently attended SA and Qld concerts and noted the comparison.

# 15. CLOSING REMARKS BY CHAIRMAN

We have considered many things and have to build on the past, consider the present and move forward to the future, which is ahead of us. We will approach Marrickville Council concerning re-visiting schools.

Appreciation was expressed to Ritchie for the use of the Selwyn Theatre. Endorsed by acclamation.

# Marrickville Organ Report for Annual General Meeting November 2010

The following repairs were carried out during the year:

A pallet in the 16' Tuba chest had come adrift causing the note to cipher during the tuning prior to the member's show. As there was no time to carry out repairs prior to the performance, the pipe had to be blocked off. The pallet is a leathered disc attached to the pneumatic motor with a screw. The pallet is allowed to float slightly so that it seats correctly. Over a period of time the screw hole in the pallet had worn to the point where it slipped past the head of the screw. It was rectified before the next show.



Some re-leathering has been carried out to the Tibia and Vox Humana chests.



Felt on some of the Harp mallets had become worn giving these notes an undesirable "xylophone-like" quality particularly around the middle C area of the accompaniment manual, probably the most used octave of the harp. An additional layer of felt has been added to these.



The Harp

Loose stoppers in the Bourdon pipes have been attended to.

Work is continuing on the Chrysoglott/Vibraphone project. The "paddles" have now been fitted into the resonators (see photo).

# Australia's Silent Film Festival

### 16 October 2010

TOSA Queensland and Silent Film Australia Ltd presented an exquisite selection of shorts from the dawn of cinema and other classics of the silent era from 1907-1929 with works by de Chomon , Melies , Chaplin, D W Griffith, Laurel and Hardy and Starewicz.

These shorts covered the illusion and spectacle of the earliest pio-

neers to the developed narratives of DW Griffith; from the brilliance of the master clowns of the silent era to the animation genius of Starewicz. Dr Ben Goldsmith from the University of Queensland skillfully introduced the sessions.

On October 16 a large audience welcomed these treasures with the superb accompaniment of David Bailey on the mighty Christie theatre pipe organ at Kelvin Grove. David's intuitive and wondrous matching of the cinema pleasures left the audience entranced. Members of the audience squealed in delight at the special sound effects of the Christie built in the 1930s and installed at Kelvin Grove in the early 1970s. The master comics drew all present into the chaos and wonder of the golden age of comedv and extracted from them howls of laughter and chortles of delight. David's touch blended the perfect balance of deftness and empathy with the films so that we were rewarded with the seamless silent film event at its best as it is meant to be. His skills and bravado presence enchanted the viewers and reminded us all of the beauty of restored silent film and live music. The silents were never silent!

A member of the audience, Sandy Barrie, brought with him the wooden silent camera used by Charles Chauvel as well as other items of technology from the era. The audience was enthralled by the story of the equipment and star struck at hand-cranking such a gem. A good number remained behind for

quite an extended period to experience these historic items and most importantly of all to visit the two chambers of the organ on each side of the stage and to talk with David and the other helpful members of TOSA Queensland on hand to answer questions.

At the session, Tradewinds Fair Trade and Organic tea and coffee were presented in a Festival showbag with other goodies. This not for profit event seeks to promote the remarkable East Timor coffee export project of Tradewinds. Details can be accessed at www. tradewinds.org.au.
