The following article about a remarkable Electronic Organ installation in New Zealand is reprinted from "Console Whispers". Can we beat this on the mainland?

The three-manual console uses drawstops, and a pipe organ of the above specifications would be an asset to any Town Hall. If however you have been mentally totting up the number of pipes in this organ, just hang fire for a while because there actually isn't a single pipe in it! Mr. John Daglish of Dominion Electronic Organ Co Ltd., Christchurch, tells us it uses twenty-two speakers spread over the proscenium arch of the stage plus an 18' pedal speaker and a full-sized horn speaker cabinet to augment this. Previously an English Jennings, apparently the entire original unstable electronic content of this organ is being rebuilt by the above company, and should be finished early in 1972. Mr. Daglish thinks this organ could be of interest to Society members, and believes it to be about twice the size of any other large electronic organ installation in this country.

REGINALD PORTER-BROWN TO VISIT AUSTRALIA

Reginald Porter-Brown, the "Organist Extraordinary" has accepted an invitation to tour Australia; the tour will be extensive and will include recitals on many types of organ.
